OBJECTIVE

Through an integrated instructional approach, students will explore the film content.



GUIDING QUESTIONS

What factors shape our values and beliefs? How can content area studies serve as a vehicle for change/understanding? How do beliefs, ethics and values influence behavior? How can a person's decisions and actions change his/her life?

Activity 1: **Topography** – lesson includes tectonic plates, sea floor exploration, mass & volume of mauna & islands, movement of plates and the influence of these movements in the creation of land – extension lesson will go into location (lat. & long.) and the importance of central location in the Pacific.

Activity 2: **Importance of & Relationship to Place** – lesson includes sacredness, kuleana, cultural rights and practices, and how a place shapes a person: identity: seeing ourselves as 'āina



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ΑCTIVITIES CONT.

Activity 3: <u>Meaning of 'Ohana</u> – lesson includes what is means to go beyond and into the understanding that all are related to the seen and unseen

Activity 4: **Development**: lesson includes impact on culture, place, and people

Activity 5: Hula: Cultural Practices – lesson includes the importance of moʻolelo and history

Activity 6: <u>Watershed</u> – lesson includes, watercycle knowledge, aquifer investigations, waterway identification, and kuleana to all of it

Activity 7: **<u>Elemental Influences</u>** – lesson would include interactions and influences of 'āina, traditional names of elements, and akua associated with elements – kuleana to natural patterns, cycles, systems, and phenomena

Activity 8: **Impact of Development on Place and People** – lesson includes emotional trauma, disconnection, alterations of ancient systems

Activity 9: <u>**Realms: Nā Wao**</u> – lesson would examine layers of various types (soil, elevation, plant and animal life, atmosphere, etc.



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Activity 10: <u>Environmental Impacts</u> – lesson would include research of native species, place names, and land features

Activity 11: **<u>Piko: Mo'okū'auhau</u>**: Connection to place – lesson would include living in harmony with the natural pulse of the 'āina, piko alignment and connection, foundational/cultural anchors

Activity 12: The Power of Pule and Ceremony - lesson would include, Aha: Holding Space

Activity 13: **Purpose of Testimony**: lesson includes protecting native/ cultural rights - kuleana

Activity 14: Respect of Kūpuna

Activity 16: Kuleana
